- their application is supported by impeccable references from their current employer and, if appropriate, by a medical practitioner
- If a practitioner has been restored to the UKCC's register and is subsequently required to appear before the Professional Conduct Committee again on new charges, the fact that the practitioner has previously been found guilty of serious professional misconduct and removed from the register will be made available to the committee considering the new charges. The UKCC retains a record of the restoration for the lifetime of the practitioner.
