Diagnosis: Down's Syndrome & Atrio-Ventricular Septal Defect

This baby is struggling. At three months he is still having to be almost entirely tube fed and his Frusemide has been increased 4 mgs twice daily.

He looks reasonably well nourished but quite small. He is grunting a bit and has mild icterus, but the liver is only about 2 cm below the right costal margin, which for a Down's baby represents a minimal enlargement. As before there is no obvious systolic murmur, but a short diastolic murmur or third heart sound.

I will continue with his Frusemide 4 mgs twice daily for the moment and I have arranged for him to be reviewed in two months time. Shortly after that appointment we will need for him to come up to Bristol to have a cardiac-catheter and review his suitability for operative correction, which is likely to have to be done during the early part of next year.
