

circumstance, on clinical grounds, I felt it was justified for the operation to proceed.

There was no problems with Joshua Loveday's coronary arteries diagnosed pre-operatively. The multiple orifices found at operation could not have been expected to have been diagnosed pre-operatively. The anterior position of the right coronary artery, which was picked up, made it difficult to transfer; but this problem is a recognised one and it is usually possible to deal with in a straightforward manner.

After Joshua Loveday's operation, and before Mr. Pawade arrived, I referred all my high risk cases to Birmingham.
