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| 18/11/89 | <p>Dear Dr Schutt.</p> <p>Thank you very much for seeing this unfortunate child. I operated on him a week ago, when Tetralogy of Fallot was repaired without any technical problem. Post operative he did very well for first four hours, after which his haemodynamic state deteriorated rapidly. For about 12-18 hours his B.P. was ranging around 45-55 mm Hg (Syst.) in spite of very high dose of Adrenaline, DOPAMINE & Dobutamine Support. He also went in to renal failure, for which he was dialysed peritoneally. Haemodynamic state later stabilised & his Catecholamine Support now is minimal. His renal function has improved & P.D. has been discontinued.</p> <p>Unfortunately his neurological state has not improved. For last 5 days his pupils have remained dilated & fixed. Paralyzing agents & sedation has been stopped now for 48 hours, but there is no sign of activity. E.E.G. has just been carried out which is waiting for Dr Morgan's report, but to my unskilled eyes looks very distressing.</p> <p>I would value your assessment & advice for further management of this very unfortunate child.</p> <p>Thank you.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">000008 M.
